Answering questions in the target language Rationale A requirement of the MFL GCSE 2016 is for students to answer some questions in the target language: In listening (AO1) 20 - 30% of the marks must be awarded for responses to questions set in the assessed language In speaking (AO2) students will be required to express themselves solely in the assessed language In reading (AO3) 30 - 40% of
